Dick Bivins Stadium Will Mark its 75th Anniversary in 2025

Dick Bivins Stadium, site of countless Amarillo high school football games, at least hundreds of other regional high school playoff contests and in its early days' exhibition games involving National Football League teams, will mark its 75th anniversary in 2025.

The 15,000-seat concrete stadium was one of the premier high school stadiums in Texas when it opened in 1950. It was known initially as Amarillo Stadium, thanks to a naming contest sponsored by the Amarillo Public School District and the Sandstorm, the Amarillo High School student newspaper.

The winning name, "Amarillo Stadium," was submitted by Dan Bill Pavillard, (AHS '51), a friend of mine in River Road. I googled Dan's name while preparing this story and found that he died in Eugene, Oregon, in 2002 after a distinguished career as an arts philanthropist.

In 1958 it was renamed Dick Bivins Stadium in honor of the Amarillo business and civic leader.

The stadium which has been host to many other events than football games, including track meets and evangelism crusades, replaced Butler Field, a wooden edifice on East Second Street.

I attended at least two games at Butler Field, including one of the games played by the 1948 Sandie team that went all the way to the state finals before losing to Waco High School, 21-0.

The other that I remember was a regional playoff game between Phillips High School and Post High School, I believe. I think it was a Class AA playoff at a time when that was as far as Class A or AA schools advanced in the state playoff system. They didn't play for a state championship.

I remember that game because it was the first time I saw a high school team run the T formation instead of the single wing, which was being used by Amarillo High School under Coach Howard "Bull" Lynch.

I also remember it because the Phillips backfield's heaviest player weighed 137 pounds and because I got to see the Phillips 66ers basketball team and their star center, Bob "Foothills" Kurland, who were attending the game.

The 66ers were an amateur team sponsored by Phillips Petroleum Company and regularly won 50 games or more while losing a half dozen or less during the regular season. Professional basketball enjoyed far less prominence in the 1940s and '50s than it does today.

Kurland was one of the most famous of the 66ers. The seven-footer may have been the tallest player in basketball at the time. The team left the high school football game before it was over and when they stood to leave, I thought Kurland would never stop standing up. He was awesome.

At least two Amarillo High School alumni played for the 66ers. Jewell McDowell, (AHS '47), was a star guard for them in 1952-'54, and Gib Ford, (AHS '50) played for them in 1954-'55 and 1956-'57.

Following his AHS playing days and before joining the 66ers, McDowell attended Texas A&M and was the first Aggie basketball player to be named All-America. He lived across the street from me on North Pierce Street when I was a boy.

Back to Butler Field: The stadium was across Second Street from Eads Hide and Wool, a company that processed dead livestock for their hides. Some of the animals evidently arrived in an advanced state of putrefaction because if the breeze shifted to the east during a game, the fans got a lot more than their money's worth.

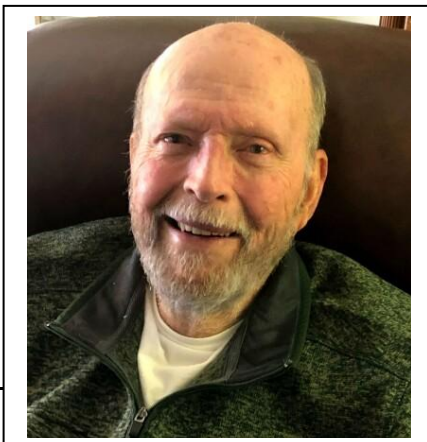

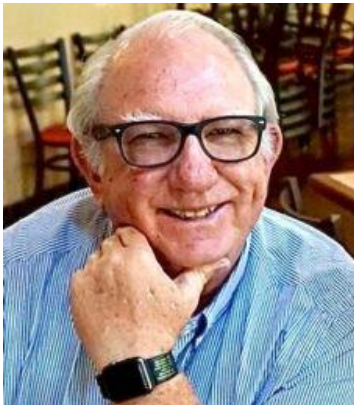
